BACKGROUND OF PESG MONEY:

The Government has provided additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in Primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to Primary school Head Teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and is only for children in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Summary of PESG 2017/2018

Objectives of spending PESG:

- To develop active, positive playtimes and lunchtimes for our children including training for all adults to support this
- To improve the provision at Barn Croft by introducing a selection of taster sports in after school clubs for all KS1 & KS2 pupils
- To develop a love of sport and physical activity
- To encourage children to develop into healthy adults
- To encourage children to deal with anxiety and stress and develop techniques for wellbeing and a healthy lifestyle for the future
