Nature of support 2015/16

Additional Support was used in two main areas: 1.) Academic support 2). Extra-curricular support

Academic Support:

- The employment of a specialist Maths Teacher (secondary trained) for two days a week to support and challenge pupils in Maths in years 5 & 6. Including additional Booster Groups and Easter school.
- The employment of an experienced Primary teacher for two days a week to support and challenge pupils in English in years 5 & 6
- The employing of the services of a Speech & Language therapist to assess pupils and train adults to run small groups
- The employing of the services of an Educational Psychologist to assess pupils and provide reports for referring pupils for further support.
- The employing of teaching assistants to be trained in the delivery of specific effective interventions to ensure the achievement & progress of all disadvantaged pupils

Extra-curricular Support:

- The employing of a trained child counsellor for two days per week to offer one to one sessions for parents and children and run small groups to improve emotional & social well-being of pupils. Also to provide a drop-in session at lunchtime for pupils to access to talk through problems in a shorter time slot.
- Subsidising the cost of the Y6 residential trip to Gilwell Park in June.
- Subsidising Breakfast Club
- Subsidising After School Club
- Theatre/Panto trips for all pupils once a year
- The secondary trained Maths teacher also began our Gardening Club (started in previous year) and is developing into an enterprise business with the school kitchen and a local café using the produce to provide healthy organic vegetable dishes.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

We measure the impact of the Pupil Premium funding in many ways across the school. We will publish information on the impact of Pupil Premium Grant funding at the end of the school year in July 2016.
